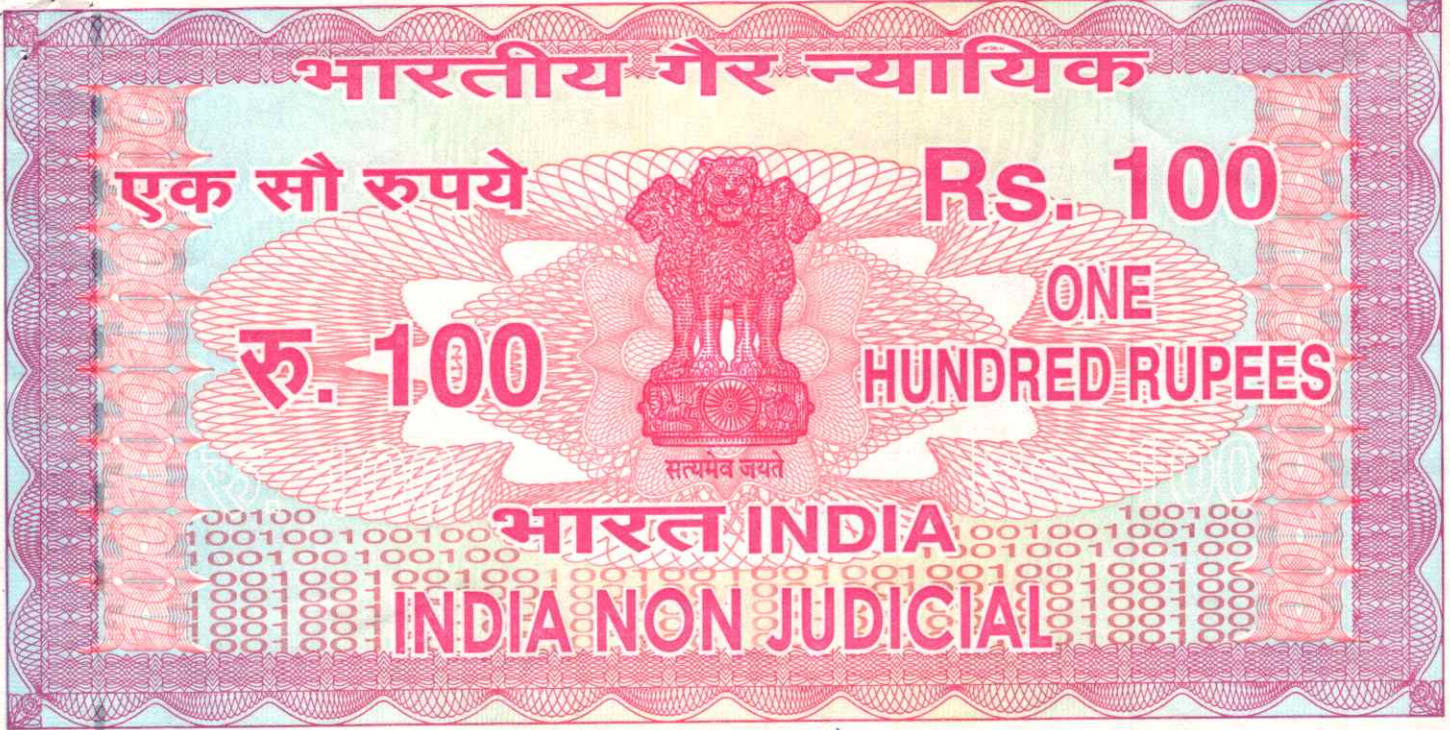
Area of Co-operation:

- Joint research activities will be taken up by both the parties. The focus area would be to develop a strong research culture, work on possible synergy on joint patent, engineering designing, developing research framework, usage of latest statistical tools and identifying areas of research activities of national interest and further work on the same. Most of the initial activities can be done with the support of Technology, Email/webEx/Skype/Telephone. Based on requirements physical movements of faculties and students also would be encouraged.
- Each will allow other to publish research papers in their respective journals.
- Each will appoint a liaison officer for smooth functioning.
- This MOU includes the provision of faculty/student exchange, joint conference/seminar/workshop and other areas of extension activities.
- Initial period of engagement would be of 3 years. Further engagement is subject to consent from both the parties.

the students and faculties in both.






The signing the MOU will benefit student community and both will borne out their expenses separately taking into consideration of welfare of student community.

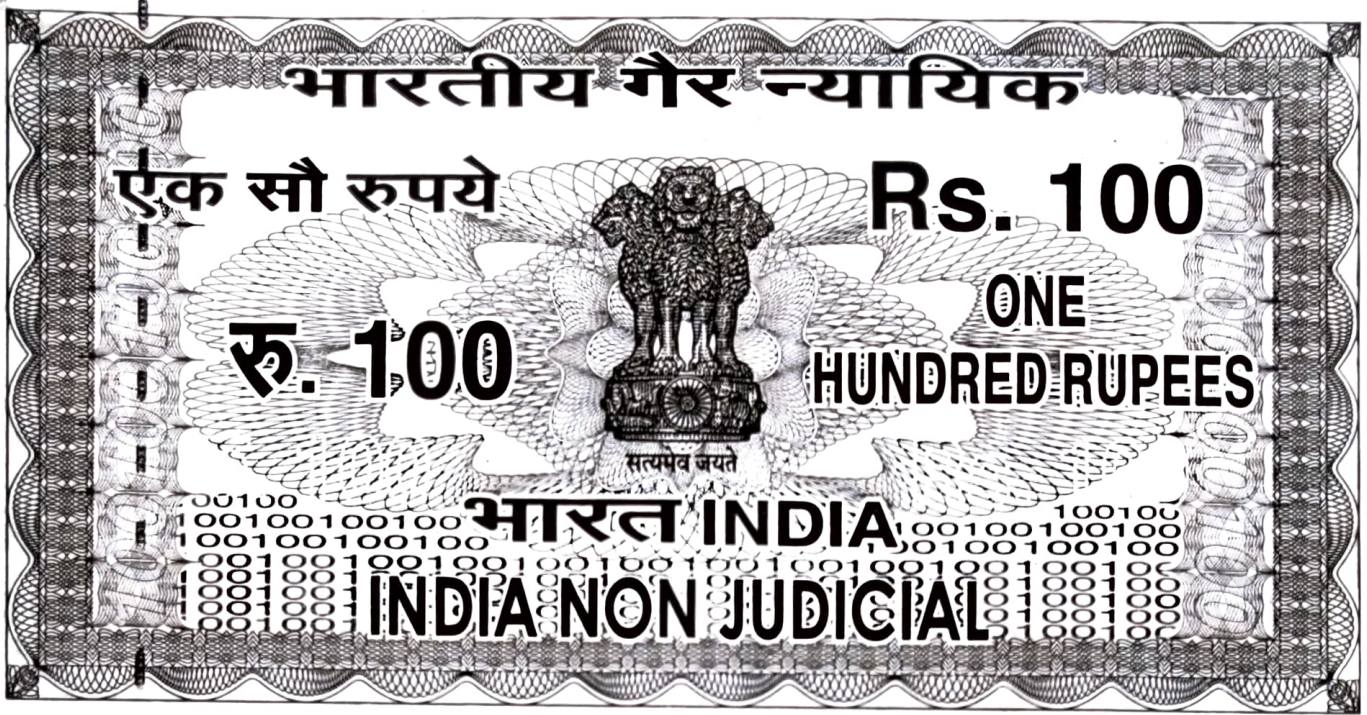

Party Two authorises Principal and Dean of Academic/ Deans, Vivekanandha College of Arts and Sciences for Women [Autonomous], Elayampalayam, Tiruchengode - Tk, Namakkal District, Tamil Nadu -637205, India to collaborate with Party One.

A. Objectives

The goal of this cooperation is to foster collaboration, provide opportunity for global experience and to facilitate advancement of knowledge on the basis of reciprocity, best efforts, mutual benefit and frequent interactions. Periyar University, Salem and Vivekanandha College of Arts and Sciences for Women [Autonomous], Tiruchengode agree to explore the possibility of engaging in the following modes of collaboration:

1. The Nodal Officer, B.Voc., Programme, Periyar University located in PeriyarPalkalai Nagar, Salem - 636 011, Tamil Nadu representing Party One shall execute the responsibilities relating to General Education Component and Skill Components according to the guidelines for B.Voc., Programme.
2. Party Two shall
 - a. Provide Technical knowhow and Trainers to execute Language (English/Hindi) component of Certificate and Diploma level of B.Voc., Programmes in Food Science and Nutrition and Textiles and Apparel Design.
 - b. Provide Internship and Industrial Visit provision to students.
 - c. Provide Training to such faculty who volunteer to equip themselves in the instruction of skill components.

Periyar University, Salem and Vivekanandha College of Arts and Sciences, Tiruchengode agree that the following technical descriptions will guide each proposed activity identified and agreed upon by the two institutions.

The terms of any financial arrangements will be subjected to separate agreements made on a case-by-case basis; such further agreements will include the names of those persons responsible for managing the implementation etc. of collaborative activity.

B. Exchange of Faculty, Scientist and Staff

Both the parties agree to explore ways to encouraging collaboration between faculty and scientists from the two institutions. Specifically, the two institutions would encourage members of their faculty to undertake short visits or take up fixed terms assignments as Visiting Professors. The terms and conditions for each visit or an assignment, including those concerning stipend, travel and housing would be worked out between the partner institutions.

C. Exchange of Scientific and Technical Material

Both the parties will examine ways of exchanging information on educational programmes and teaching/learning materials and other literature relevant to their educational and research programmes. Further, both agree to explore ways to share teaching/learning materials (including electronic/ webcasts of lectures etc.) and other relevant literature, subject to each institutions policy on intellectual property and publications.

D. Co-Ordination

The following arrangement is suggested for the co-ordination of collaboration:

- a) Each of the institution shall appoint one member of its teaching / research faculty to coordinate the programme on its behalf. A coordination committee, consisting of

- b) The Registrar, Periyar University Salem or his/her nominee,
- c) The Chairman, Vivekanandha College of Arts and Sciences for Women [Autonomous], Tiruchengode or his/her nominee,
- d) B.Voc. Programme coordinators from Periyar University, Salem and
- e) Vivekanandha College of Arts and Sciences for Women [Autonomous], Tiruchengode will periodically review and identify ways to strengthen cooperation between the two institutions.

E. Tenure and Termination


This MoU will take effect from the date it is signed by the representatives of the two institutions. It will remain valid for a period of five years. This MoU will be reviewed after three years; the terms of this MoU may be amended by mutual written agreement prior to the date of review. Any extension to this MoU will be formally agreed in writing by the parties.

Either Institution may terminate the MoU by giving written notice to the other Institution Six months in advance. Once terminated, neither Periyar University, Salem nor Vivekanandha College of Arts and Sciences for Women [Autonomous], Tiruchengode will be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise, which the other institutions may suffer. However, both the parties will ensure that all activities on progress are allowed to complete successfully.

F. Arbitration Clause

Should there be a dispute relating to any aspect of academic cooperation, The Registrar, Periyar University, Salem and The Chairman, Vivekanandha College of Arts and Sciences for Women [Autonomous], Tiruchengode will jointly resolve the dispute in a spirit of independence, mutual respect and shared responsibility.






Memorandum of Understanding

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING entered into on the 31st day of January, 2017 between Madurai and Erode Chapters of the Institute of Cost Accountants of India having its office at 6, North Vadampokki street, Madurai -625001 and second floor, 32 Prakasam street, Erode-638001 (Hereinafter called as FIRST PARTY) represented by its **Chairman S. KUMARARAJAN** and **Chairman R. GOPAL**, of the First part

and

Vivekanandha College of Arts and Sciences for Women, (Autonomous) (hereinafter referred to as VICAS), run by Angammal Educational Trust, having its office at Elayampalayam, Tiruchengode - 637 205, Namakkal District represented by its **Principal/Authorised Signatory** of the second part.



9. Coaching classes(Foundation) -per subject-minimum required- 40 sessions for problem – oriented and 30 sessions for theory - oriented and in total 140 sessions and amount payable is Rs.28,000/-(140*200)
10. 100 Hours Computer Training is to be imparted to CMA Intermediate course. The college, for offering computer training, shall provide necessary infrastructure in terms of computers & requisite qualified IT manpower to impart such training. Minimum 10 computers with 2:1 ratio of Students to Computers are essential for imparting Computer Training along with Tally ERP 9.0 (Multiuser). The Erode Chapter shall reimburse Rs.1000/- per student for facilities (Rs.20000/- per batch) and Rs.200/- per Hour for faculty (100*200=Rs.20000). At the request of the college, the faculty for the required stream, say, Tally ERP 9.0/ e filing etc. may be arranged by the Madurai/Erode Chapter. The out of pocket Expenses are to be borne by the college. In case the department could not organize, the chapter shall arrange to provide the requisite computer training at the institution recognized by the chapter.
11. Amount payable by the Erode chapter to the College for incidental charges is Rs.250/- per student per batch.
12. The Department of Commerce, Vivekanandha College of Arts and Sciences for Women is to Co-ordinate, maintain attendance, schedule of classes conducted with time and date.
13. In the event of minimum of 20 students are not enrolled in any of the CMA courses, the students shall attend the oral coaching classes at Erode Chapter of ICAI.

CMA COURSES DETAILS

1. **INTERMEDIATE COURSE REGISTRATION FEE** – Rs 12,000/- (Including Study Materials, Oral Coaching fees, Computer Training Charges Etc.,)/ the First Installment before 31st October of the year and Rs.8000/- the Second Installment before 31st January of the subsequent year (Total Rs.20000/-)

FOUNDATION COURSE REGISTRATION FEE – Rs 4,000/- (Including study materials and oral coaching fees)

By direct payment to Institute of Cost Accountants of India, through designated bank challan/ Demand Draft, payable at Kolkata.

2. Application form Rs.250/- to be purchased from Erode/Madurai Chapter
3. Administration fee payable to Madurai chapter is Rs.250/- per student
4. Syllabus and a set of books will be provided to the college by the Erode chapter.
5. The oral coaching classes to be conducted when 20 or more students are admitted in a batch.
6. No. of faculties Required - Minimum 4 for subjects per group of 4 papers and 2 for computer training (Intermediate Group I and Group II)
Minimum of 4 for Foundation Course
7. Faculty Remuneration (payable by ICAI, Erode Chapter):
CMA Intermediate classes- 1 Lecture Session of 60 minutes – Rs250/-
CMA Foundation classes- 1 Lecture Session of 60 minutes – Rs200/-
8. Coaching classes(Intermediate) -per subject-minimum required– 45 sessions for one paper and in total 180 sessions for 4 papers and amount payable is Rs.45000/-(4*45*250) per group and for 2 groups Rs.90000/- .



WHEREAS the FIRST PARTY is conducting Oral Coaching Classes for CMA Course examinations of The Institute of Cost Accountants of India, Kolkata.

WHEREAS the SECOND PARTY has shown interest in organizing such Oral Coaching Classes for CMA courses exclusively for their students, who have registered for CMA course of ICAI, in the first instances at their premises with the assistance of the FIRST PARTY.

AND

WHEREAS BOTH THE PARTIES HAVE DESIRED TO DEDUCE IN WRITING, THEIR MUTUAL RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES NOW, THEREFORE, THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITNESSTH AS BELOW:

ICAI Madurai /Erode Chapter hereby grants its permission to Department of Commerce, Vivekanandha College of Arts and Sciences for Women (Autonomous) (VICAS), Elayampalayam, Tiruchengode - 637 205 to conduct CMA Inter Courses to the students of Post graduate and eligible foundation course passed U.G. students in their College, and CMA Foundation course to the under graduate students upon conditions herein contained.

1. a) The second party has agreed to remit to the ICAI Kolkata through designated bank challan /demand draft payable at Kolkata, a sum of Rs. 12000/- (Rupees twelve thousand only) being first installment per student admitted by them to **CMA Intermediate Course** from their college on or before 31st October of the year/at the time of admission and Rs.250/- to the Erode/Madurai chapter for cost of application and Rs. 250/- to the Madurai Chapter for administration expenses
- b) Similarly, the second party has also agreed to remit the second installment of Rs.8000/- (Rupees eight thousand only) per student on or before 31st January of the subsequent year for June term of examinations/on or before 31st July for December term examinations.

Or



c) The second party may remit to the ICAI Kolkata through designated bank challan/demand draft payable at Kolkata, a sum of Rs.20000/- (Rupees Twenty thousand only) as single payment on or before 31st January for the June examinations of the year. Likewise, for December examination of the year, the amount for admission is to be paid on or before 31st July of that year.


1. The second party has agreed to remit to the ICAI Kolkata through designated bank challan/demand draft payable at Kolkata, a sum of Rs.4000/- (Rupees four thousand only) per student admitted by them to CMA Foundation Course from their college on or before 31st October of the year and Rs.250/- to the Erode/Madurai chapter for cost of application and Rs. 250/- to the Madurai Chapter for Administration expenses.
2. The students admitted are under the Erode Chapter Jurisdiction.
3. It is agreed that the SECOND PARTY shall provide necessary facilities to conduct Oral coaching classes in their premises.
4. The services of faculty of SECOND PARTY can be availed of, by the FIRST PARTY to conduct Oral Coaching classes.
5. The SECOND PARTY may utilize the professional services of the faculty members of the FIRST PARTY for guest lectures, and organize seminars, conferences etc., in collaboration with the FIRST PARTY.
6. The FIRST PARTY will arrange to issue the coaching completion certificates for the eligible students.
7. For Issuance, of course completion certificate by the FIRST PARTY to the students of the SECOND PARTY, the faculty members of the FIRST PARTY/SECOND PARTY are to conduct at least one examination to satisfy them, before issue of the said certificate by the FIRST PARTY. In addition, the students should have attended a minimum of 70 % of the classes held.





8. It shall be the responsibility of FIRST PARTY to pay remuneration to faculty and bear incidental expenses relating to oral coaching classes/computer Training conducted at the premises of SECOND PARTY.
9. This Understanding is reached based on good faith and support to be extended by both parties to conduct ICAI courses. Hence, such terms which are spelt out herein could be discussed mutually and agreed thereupon benefitting both the parties herein.
10. The Memorandum of Understanding is agreed upon by both the parties without prejudice to the rights of the ICAI, Madurai/Erode chapter to run coaching classes for ICAI examinations as it is being done now.
11. This MOU is initially valid for Three years and is extendable further as mutually agreed at the option of the college. The MOU may be terminated on agreement at the option of the Madurai/Erode Chapter.



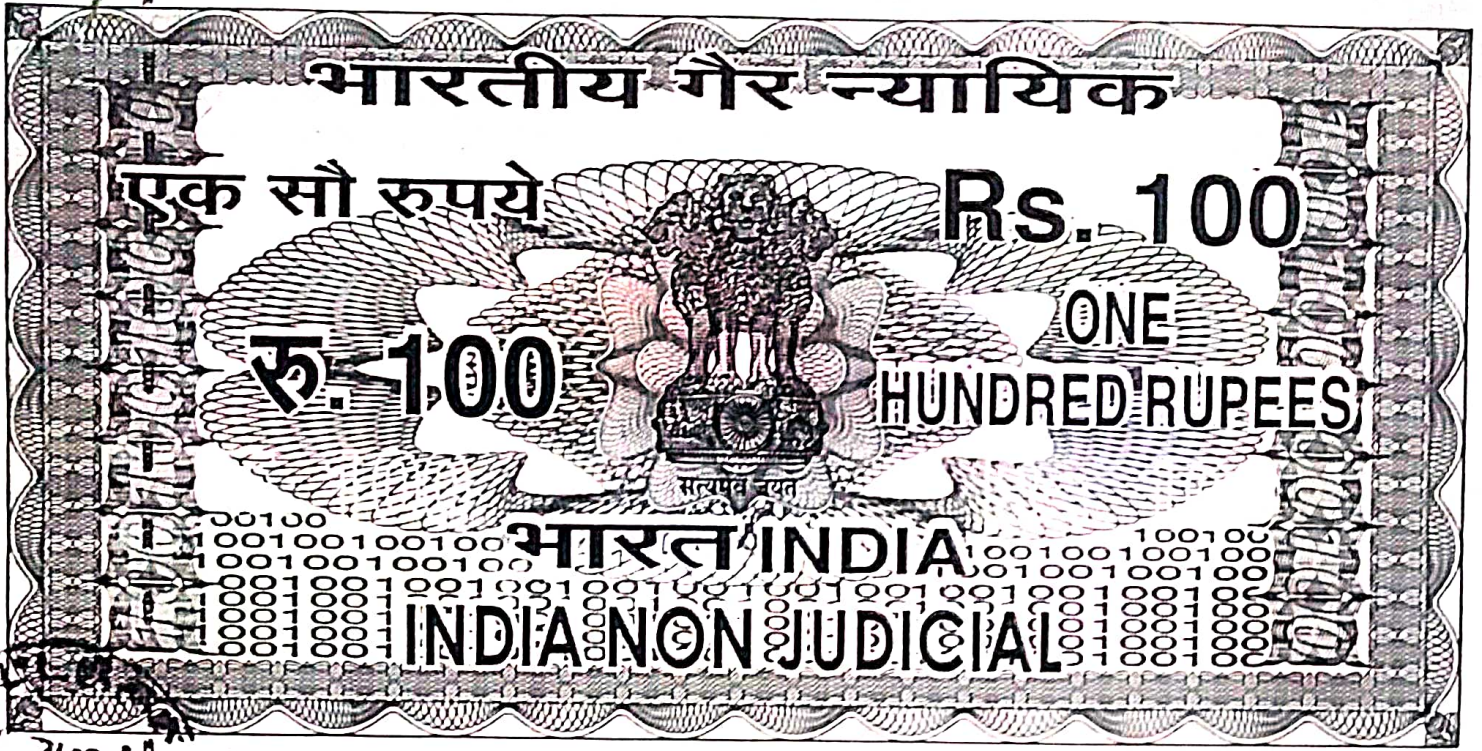

The terms Lessor and Lessee shall whenever the context so requires, mean and include their respective heirs, legal representatives, executors, administrators, transferees, assigns and successors – in – interest/office.

Whereas the Lessor offered to provide a facility located at **VIVEKANANDHA EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS** campus to the Lessee together with necessary electrical and sanitary fittings, the lessee agreed to take on lease the designated area and

Whereas the Lessor and the Lessee have agreed to reduce such terms and conditions into writing.


NOW THIS DEED OF LEASE WITNESSETH AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Lessor agreed to let on lease the facility together with all the infrastructure and the lessee has agreed to take on lease the facility.
2. **DURATION:** The Lease shall be for duration of 1 year commencing from 1st June 2016
3. **THE PURPOSE OF LEASE:** The lease shall use the rented area only for the purpose and nature of business, now carried on by the Lessee, Viz., KPO/Knowledge Services/IT /ITES.
4. **FACILITY CHARGES:**
 - a. The rent shall be paid at the rate of Rs. 19 per square feet per month. (Rupees nineteen only). Total space of 2130 sq.ft
 - b. Lessor shall provide facility Air-conditioner, furniture, Genset back up maintenance, housekeeping facility, common security, drinking water for the employees. Lessee agrees to pay Rs. 100 per seat per month
 - c. The computer rental hire charges of Rs. 500 per month per machine (Rupees Five hundred)

Memorandum of Understanding

This deed of Memorandum of Understanding is executed between Vivekanandha Labs (one part of Vivekanandha Medical Care Hospital (VMCH)) Elayampalayam, Tiruchengode, Namakkal and represented by its Executive Director Dr.S.Arthanareeswaran MBBS., MD.,

AND

Department of Microbiology, Vivekanandha College of Arts and Science for Women Elayampalayam, Tiruchengode, Namakkal represented by its Principal Dr.B.T.Sureshkumar Msc., M.Phil., Ph.D.,

In order to attain the above objectives, VMCH has expressed its desire to enter into an agreement with VICAS for the aforesaid purpose through the VICAS

NOW THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH AS FOLLOWS:

- (1) The objective of the Agreement is to improve the overall efficiency of the patient care by providing a wide and varied menu of laboratory tests at point-of-care, through efficient logistics, quality processing and optimal TAT.
- (2) The agreement will come into effect from 16.09.2015 TO 15.09.2016
- (3) VICAS consents to perform tests within its scope, on samples that are referred from Department of Microbiology.
 - (a) In continuation with this commitment, VICAS shall be responsible for the following
 - (b) Providing for sample pick-up from the lab wherever feasible on mutual agreement.
 - (c) Transport of samples from VMCH to the testing facilities of VICAS under controlled conditions for analysis.
 - (d) Providing packing material, containers and sample collection tubes to VMCH on specific request.
 - (e) Carrying out of specified tests within optimal TAT with proper QC measures.
 - (f) Providing proper instructions for sample collection and transport.
 - (g) Providing adequate customer support / technical support with respect to samples, reports and their interpretation.
 - (h) Delivery of reports by the mode mutually agreed upon.
- (4) VMCH on its part is bound to honor the following conditions:-
 - a. Strictly adhere to the defined requirements for sample collection and preparation.
 - b. Obtain and provide adequate clinical data on the request forms provided.
 - c. Keep track of the reporting schedule of tests and make commitments to the patient / client accordingly.
 - d. Clarify discrepancies with VICAS before making any statements to the client / patient.

- e. Invoice will be raised on a fortnightly basis. VMCH shall honor to clear all bills pertaining to the tests referred, within 30 days of receipt of invoice. Failure to pay within the specified time limit will lead to termination of contract
- f. Taxes (TDS) can be deducted as per applicable norms and the certificate for the same should be sent to VICAS on a Quarterly basis failing which VMCH is agreeing herewith to reimburse the same to VICAS.

(5) VICAS will not be responsible for pre-analytical errors in case of samples received from VMCH and the reports pertain to the sample as received by VICAS.

(6) Each party warrants that the statements made relating to it in this Agreement are true and accurate and that nothing further needs to be stated to prevent such statements from being misleading.

(7) TERMINATION

- a. Each of the following events shall constitute an Event or Default.
 - (i) Any party breaches or fails to perform any material term, covenant, agreement or undertaking contained in this Agreement and such breach or failure, if capable of remedy is not remedied within thirty (30) days after written notice of such breach or failure is received from any party.
 - (j) any representation or warranty made by party in this Agreement is found to be false, inaccurate or misleading in any material respect; or
 - (k) Either VMCH or VICAS is adjudicated or declared bankrupt or insolvent or propose to make any arrangement or composition with any assignment for the benefit of the creditors or if an administrator or receiver is appointed over any party of the assets or undertaking of such party;
- b. If the occurrence of any or default as specified in (8 a) above is attributable to the acts of VMCH, VICAS shall be entitled to give notice of termination of this Agreement and the Agreement shall be deemed to have been terminated on the expiry of one month from the date of termination notice.
- c. If the occurrence of any event or default as specified in (8 a) is attributable to the acts or omissions of VICAS, then VMCH shall be entitled to give notice of

termination of this Agreement to MHL and the agreement shall be deemed to have been terminated on the expiry of one month from the date of termination notice.


- d. The termination or purported termination of this agreement shall be without prejudice to any claim or rights of action of any party previously accrued to it against either party.

SUMMARY OF NATIONAL CONFERENCE

ON

DIGITAL INDIA: PROSPECTS AND CHALLENGES

A Two Day National Conference was conducted by the Department of Commerce and Management on 09.08.17 and 10.08.17. The first day program was started on 09.08.17 by 10.30 a.m. with the prayer song byto brighten the auspicious day and to make the programme successful. It was followed by lightening the Kuthuvilakku by the dignitaries on the dias.

The session started with the Welcome Address by Dr. K. Priya, HOD of Commerce who welcomed the gathering. The Chief Guests were introduced and honoured with shawl and memento in a traditional way. The college had pride to sign MOU with MTC Global, Member Teachers Consortium, Bangalore.

PRINCIPAL ADDRESS

The Principal of VICAS Dr. B.T.Sureshkumar welcomed the participants present in the conference and appreciated the Department for organizing the National Conference. Principal gave a brief explanation about Digital India. Digital India is a Programme to prepare India for a knowledge future. The focus is on being transformative – to realize IT + IT = IT. The focus is on making technology central to enabling change. It is an Umbrella Programme – covering many departments. It weaves together a large number of ideas and thoughts into a single, comprehensive vision so that each of them is seen as part of a larger goal. Each individual element stands on its own. But is also part of the larger picture. It is coordinated by DeitY, implemented by the entire government. The weaving together makes the Mission transformative in totality.

THE KEYNOTE ADDRESS

The Principal Address was followed by Keynote address by the Chief Guest **Prof. Dr. Bholanath Dutta**, Founder and President MTC Global, Global Advisory Body in Management Education, Bangalore. In his address he gave a clear picture of Nine Pillars of Digital India as follows.

The Nine Pillars of Growth of Digital India

Digital India aims at three thrust areas of infrastructure as a utility to every citizen, governance and services on demand and digital empowerment of citizens. It further intends to provide thrust through nine pillars of growth areas viz., broadband highways, universal access to mobile connectivity, public internet access programme, e-governance by reforming government through technology, e-kranti (NeGP 2.0) through electronic delivery of services, information for

all, electronics manufacturing with a target of net-zero imports, IT for jobs and some early harvest programmes as depicted in the following illustration.

First Pillar – Broadband Highways

In the rural areas, the broadband highways would be implemented through Department of Telecommunications (DoT); with a capital expenditure of Rs. 32,000/- crores. The rural broadband highways intend to cover 250,000 Gram Panchayats of which 50,000 would be covered in the first year while 100,000 each would be covered in the next two years.

Second Pillar – Universal Access to Mobile Connectivity

The ongoing programmes in the area of access to phones would be focused towards increasing network penetration and coverage. Universal access to mobile connectivity would be implemented through Department of Telecommunications (DoT); with a capital expenditure of Rs. 16, 000/- crores and coverage of about 42,300 villages uncovered so far.

Third Pillar – Public Internet Access Programme – National Rural Internet Mission

Here, CSCs would be made viable through multi-functional end-points for service delivery through Gram-Panchayats. Implemented through DeitY, it would cost of Rs. 4,750 crores to increase the present reach of 130,000 to 250,000 villages.

Fourth Pillar – eGovernance: Reforming Government through Technology

Government would take up Business Process Re-engineering (BPR) using IT to improve transactions including form simplification and reduction, online applications and tracking, developing interface between departments, use of online repositories like school certificates and voter identity cards, integration of services and platforms like UIDAI, payment gateway, mobile platform and EDI.

Fifth Pillar – eKranti: Electronic Delivery of Services

The present ongoing programme (NeGP) would be revamped to cover various elements to bring eKranti. This would include fostering technology in the areas of planning, agriculture, education, health, financial inclusion, justice and security. The technology for planning would include GIS based decision making and National GIS Mission Mode Project.

Sixth Pillar – Information for All

The pillar of 'information to all' would encompass making information online and hosting websites and documents. This would result into an easy and open access to information by the public in general along with development of open data platforms.

4) Poor connectivity

The report estimated that India needs over 80 lakh hotspots as against the availability of about 31,000 hotspots at present to reach the global level of one Wi-Fi hotspot penetration for every 150 people.

5) Proper Policy Making

To enable development of digital infrastructure, it said that a uniform (Right of Way) RoW policy across all states with a reasonable cost structure is required along with a single window mechanism for granting RoW permissions.

Dr. V. Senthil Kumar, Assistant Professor, VICAS proposed vote of thanks and the function was over by 4.00.p.m.

CONCLUSION

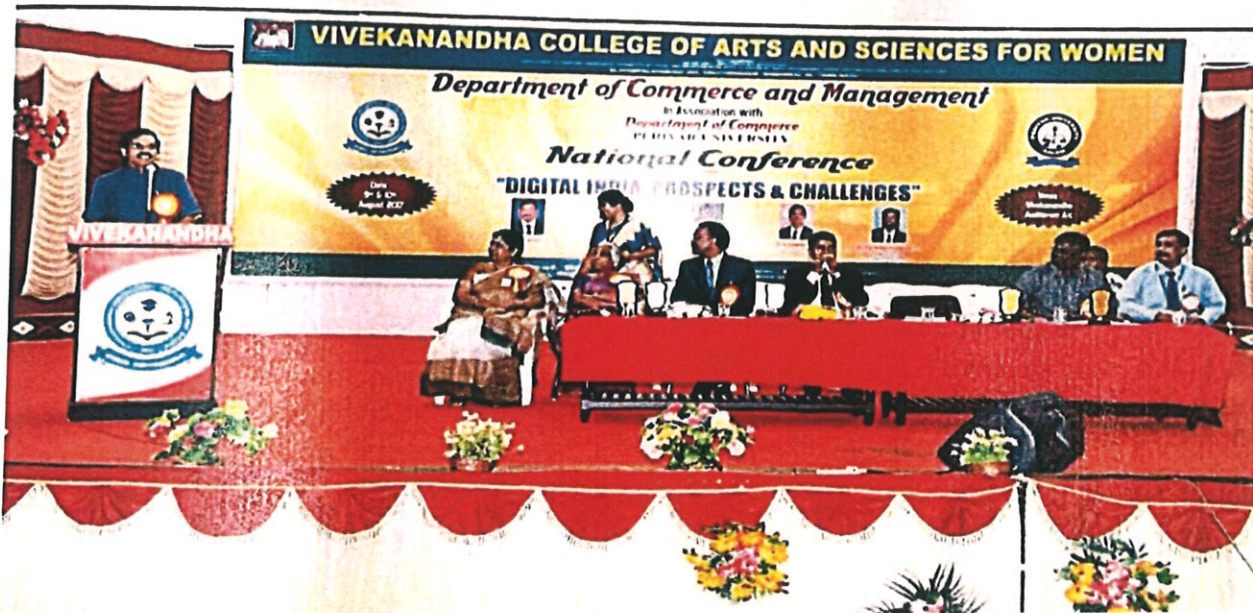

While both countries are aware of the merits of trade, a variety of political and infrastructural-physical, legal, and regulatory-impediments have virtually paralyzed bilateral trade relations between the two neighbors. It is very clear that Pakistan's economic development will depend

to a large extent on normalizing relations with India to pave the way for South Asian regional economic integration.

INAUGURAL ADDRESS

Keynote address was followed by Inaugural address by **Dr. SACHIN N.PARDHE, Professor, Department of Civics and Politics, University of Mumbai, Mumbai.**

He mentioned that in 1996, India accorded Most Favored Nation (MFN) status to Pakistan thereby offering Pakistan the same trading regime as it offers to any other country in the world. Pakistan, on the other hand, continued to allow imports of a limited number of items from India, collectively known as the positive list; although the number of items on the list has increased gradually. The positive list was even more restrictive for road-based trade, as Pakistan allowed only thirteen items on the positive list to be imported from India by road.

Dr. K.SENTHILKUMAR, Professor, Department of Political Science and Public Administration, Annamalai University, Chidambaram in his inaugural address noted that One of the most significant developments in India-Pakistan trade has been that Pakistan made substantial progress in the process of granting Most Favored Nation (MFN) status to India in 2012 by switching from the positive list approach which allowed trade in a limited number of items to a small negative list of items in which trade is not permitted. Similarly the items allowed to be traded by the road route were also increased. India, on the other hand, also undertook several measures to address non-tariff barriers as part of the trade normalization process.

SPECIAL ADDRESS

His address was followed by **Dr. DRUBHAJYOTHI BHATTACHATTARJEE, Representative, ICWA.** He addressed that India's foreign policy is to maintain peace, freedom and mutual co-operation among the nations. India's policies towards Pakistan in the current context are best understood within the framework of its overall foreign policy concerns. India's burgeoning global presence and its larger economic interests are bringing a subtle reconsideration of its policies

towards Pakistan. Despite some successes, India's economic engagement with Pakistan continues to be crippled by deep-rooted political tensions.

In India, **Mr. IMRAN KHAN** might use his cricketing background and charisma to mobilize public and political support, convincing them of the importance of peace between neighbors. Our **Honorable Prime Minister Shri NARENDRA MODI and External Affairs Minister Smt. SUSHMA SWARAJ** along with **Mr. IMRAN KHAN** have the potential to build a new legacy by promoting peace, socio-economic growth, and prosperity for the betterment of the people of both the nations.

SAARC was formed by seven-member nations of South Asia namely: Bangladesh, Bhutan, Pakistan, Nepal, Maldives, India and Sri Lanka, and these countries continued to be members till date. Afghanistan became eighth member of SAARC in 2005. SAARC maintains permanent diplomatic relations with the United Nations as an observer, and United States and South Korea are also acting as observers. The Secretariat of the Association was set up in Kathmandu on 17 January 1987. The primary objectives of the SAARC includes promoting the welfare of the people of South Asia, accelerating the Economic growth, social progress, providing dignified livelihood to all individuals and building trust and appreciation for other country's problem. It would promote trade between the member countries, solve disputes between member countries, and by grouping together, member countries can deal with international issues better. SAARC nations are cooperative in the area of agriculture, rural, biotechnology, culture, energy, environment, economy and trade, finance, funding mechanism, human resource development, poverty alleviation, people to people contact, security aspects, social development, science and technology, communications, and tourism. India because of its geography, economy, international stature and commitment to the region is central to SAARC. The SAARC region has acute asymmetrical power balance as India encompasses more than 75 percent of the region's GDP and more than 70 percent of population, territorial dependency in India is high and it possesses enormous military power compared to other countries in the region. India has a special responsibility flowing from the geography of the region and the size of its economy and followed by

Prof. BHOLANATH DUTTA, Founder & President, MTC Global, Global Advisory Body in Management Education, UN Academic Impact / UN Global Compact, Bangalore. The importance of SAARC nations in the world. Despite SAARC's dismal past Modi has boldly stroked new hope for the future of SAARC. It is therefore logical that the government would seek similar opportunities to expand and deepen the engagement with SAARC. Modi's ambition for SAARC, however, is confronted by external and internal challenges. Externally, the continuing tensions with Pakistan, the uncertainty over Afghanistan and the role of outside actors, notably China, pose threats to reinvigorating SAARC. Internally, the limited capacity of the Indian state, particularly the miniscule size of the Foreign Service as well as the ability to engage key state governments as stakeholders in foreign policy are also challenges that need to be addressed. Despite these challenges or indeed because of them cooperation through SAARC on infrastructure, energy, water, trade, climate change mitigation, higher education, healthcare, terrorism and even military cooperation would contribute to India's twin goals of development and stability in the neighborhood.

Free Trade Agreement A free trade agreement among two countries or group of countries agrees to abolish tariffs, quotas and preferences on most of the goods (if not all) between them. Countries choose an FTA if their economic structures are complementary, not competitive.

Trade Agreements

It is a bilateral treaty or any other enforceable compact which commits two or more nations to specified terms of commerce, most of time involving mutually beneficial concessions, which had been entered into the countries viz., Bangladesh, Bhutan, Ceylon, Maldives, China, Japan, Korea and Mongolia.

South Asian Free Trade Agreement

The purpose of SAFTA is to endorse and improve mutual trade and economic cooperation among the 'Contracting States' by inter-alia:

- ❖ Eliminating blockades to trade in, and facilitating the cross-border movement of goods between the territories of the Contracting States;
- ❖ Promoting conditions of fair competition in the free trade area, and ensuring equitable benefits to all Contracting States, taking into account their respective levels and pattern of economic development;
- ❖ Creating effective mechanism for the implementation and application of this Agreement, for its joint administration and for the resolution of disputes; and
- ❖ Establishing a framework for further regional cooperation to expand and enhance the mutual benefits of this Agreement.

Dr. Md. SERAJUL ISLAM PRODHAN, Associate Professor, Department of Civil Engineering & Director, Institutional Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Dhaka International University, Bangladesh, he explicate that India's foreign policy is based on the principle of Panchsheel and non-alignment. As a result, it is one of the few nations that can claim to have a "strategic autonomy" in terms of world. Such a core view has helped India in raising her stature and work progressively in terms of peace and security. India has more or less maintained its non-violent atmosphere by very smartly using it for its diplomacy for its needs. At times, sense of security has also resulted into wars especially with our western neighbor on

Some genre writers tend to straddle a line between genre-focused commercial fiction and the traditions of literary fiction. Characteristics of Genre Fiction

- Adheres to time-honored formulas for plot and character arcs
- Typically more literal with fewer obscure symbols and allegories
- Whatever symbolism might exist is typically clear and easily accessible to all readers
- Often fits specific genres like mystery, horror, science fiction (sci-fi), romance, military thrillers, and spy novels
